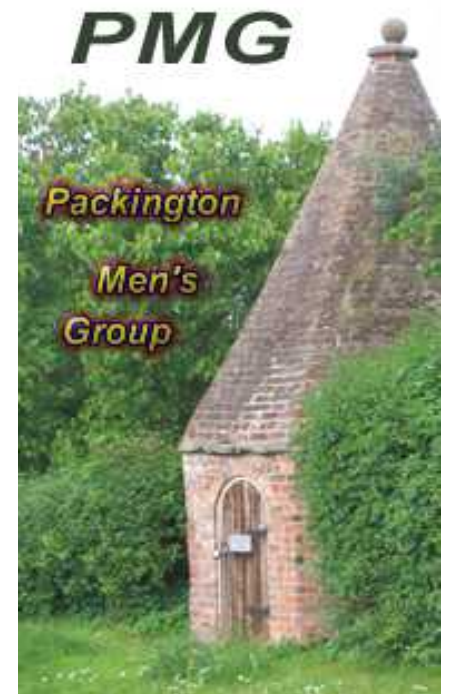
What is the PMG?

So - What IS the "Packington Men's Group"?

We are a group of men connected with Packington.

How are you "connected with Packington"?

We all know the village well. Most of us live here, many are connected with a church here, or have done so previously. Some live nearby in Ashby or Normanton.

What do you do?

We meet socially each month.

Why do you do it?

For fellowship. We enjoy meeting as friends.

When do you do it?

On the second Thursday of each month, with occasional event visits, such as music or drama, in addition.

What form do meetings take?

We have five favourites each year - a lunch, a breakfast, a guided walk, a gentle games meeting, and a Party evening. We also have external visits, and talks and presentations.

Where do you meet?

When not at an external venue, we meet at the village Memorial Hall, usually in its Meeting Room.

Why a Men's Group, not everyone?

Village ladies actually organised their own group first! There is no conflict, and we invite our ladies to some of our external visits.

Is church attendance required?

The Packington Men's Group is open to all men - attendance or membership of a church is immaterial.

Are there any age limits?

We all seem to be over 40. Or perhaps 50. Or was it 60? Most of us are retired. There are no actual limits.

What does it cost to belong?

We subscribe £1 a month, payable annually in advance. This helps pay for speakers expenses and for venue and transport costs. Outside Meal and visit charges may be extra.

How do I join?

Contact a committee member (see over), who can tell you more, and arrange for you to come to a meeting. We hope you will feel welcome, make some friends, and want to come again.
