

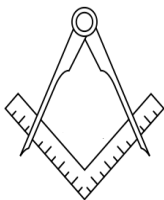
Packington Men's Group (PMG)

At our March meeting, 10 members and 3 ladies heard a talk on the topic of **Homeopathy**, at **Yew Tree Farm**. Lady guest speaker, **Sue Miles**, a qualified pharmacist, described how she became interested in Homeopathy while doing a project during a Veterinary Pharmacy course. On the project, she was convinced of the power of homeopathy in the successful treatment of animals.

Sue explained her subject thoroughly using a question and answer process. The main points she emphasised were: how people with similar illnesses could have different remedies; how homeopathy has sometimes had success where conventional medicine may have failed; that considerable savings could be made in use of expensive drugs; and how many drugs have nasty side effects for some people. Sue noted that some countries promote homeopathy more actively than our own. The talk was interesting, delivered with enthusiasm and the meeting was enjoyed by all.
