
Packington Men's Group PMG



In September PMG visited **Sharpe's Pottery Museum** at nearby Swadlincote for a wellillustrated talk by our visit guide, Tony Hurrell, pictured at left. Swadlincote caused its own demise last century, as extraction of clay and coal, for the potteries that brought wealth, incurred wholesale despoliation. Today, at the heart of the National Forest, with the potteries almost gone, the area is regenerated: this

amazing clean modern museum and conference centre with its iconic restored "Kiln Hovel" building is testimony to new civic pride. We toured the whole museum and the fascinating "Magic Attic" with its 160-year archive of local newspapers and its busy active researchers.



On Thursday 13th October at 7:15pm, in the Memorial Hall Meeting Room, an aperitif precedes our PMG evening talk by Laura Jackson, Area Co-Ordinator for Ashby Street Pastors.
